ATIS Welcomes Lt. Col. Lee

Colonel Darby McNulty, project manager for the Integrated Personnel and Pay System – Army (IPPS-A), presided over an assumption of charter ceremony welcoming Lieutenant Colonel Jim A. Lee as the new product manager for Army Training and Information System (ATIS) on July 27, 2018 at Fort Eustis, Virginia. During the ceremony, Col. McNulty welcomed Lt. Col. Lee to the IPPS-A family, saying “we’re very excited to have Jim on board. He’s coming in at a critical time. The Army desperately needs an integrated training system. We’ve been working closely with the TRADOC Capability Manager ATIS, and we have recently started this journey by awarding three competitive prototype contracts. This is an exciting time for the program and for the Army.”



In his remarks, Lt. Col. Lee thanked Col. McNulty for giving him the opportunity to serve as product manager for ATIS. He also mentioned the important work of the ATIS and Distributed Learning System team. “After successfully bringing the delivery of Army training into the digital age, we are now entrusted with combining all of army training into one cohesive program,” Lt. Col. Lee said. “One product will provide a platform for the development, resourcing, scheduling, managing and delivery of all Army Training. ATIS will save time, resources and manpower. Soldiers and leaders will be less focused on training management and more focused on quality training with the added benefit of increased readiness. What we do here is directly related to the Chief of Staff of the Army’s priorities and the future of the United States Army.”

Prior to joining the ATIS team, Lt. Col. Lee served as the Military Deputy to the District Contracting Chief, Savannah District United States Army Corps of Engineers. His previous assignments include Assistant TRADOC Capabilities Manager for BCT Mission Command Systems; Contracting Team Leader and Brigade Training Officer in the 409th Contracting Support Brigade; Commander of the Springfield Recruiting Company, St. Louis Battalion, Springfield, Illinois; and Commander of Bravo Battery, 5-5th Air Defense Artillery Battalion, Camp Hovey, Korea. Lt. Col. Lee earned his commission from Marion Military Institute as an Air Defense Officer in 1996. He holds an Associate of Arts from Marion Military Institute, Bachelor of Business, and a Masters of International Business from Florida International University.
